Valdez, AK – The community of Valdez received confirmation of one new non-resident cases of COVID-19 on Thursday evening.

The new non-resident case is an asymptomatic adult identified during employer screening. They are in isolation following the guidance of public health officials and receiving follow-up care from an onsite company medical provider. The contact investigation for this case is complete. Investigation results indicate the patient, an employee of Silver Bay Seafoods, remained in quarantine during their time in Valdez. The patient is part of the same travel cohort as the non-resident cases announced in news releases 006, 007, and 009. Public health officials believe the current risk to the community from this case is low.

Valdez must continue making thoughtful and careful decisions as long as COVID-19 remains present in Alaska and beyond. Taking small, individual actions like hand hygiene, physical distancing, wearing a cloth face covering around others, avoiding large group gatherings, and staying home when you are sick all make a big impact towards keeping our community safe.

Please continue to monitor yourself for COVID-19 symptoms which include a fever, cough, sore throat, difficulty breathing, loss of taste or smell, and any new onset of illness. If you believe you have even mild symptoms, contact your healthcare provider for screening and closely follow their instructions. Remember to call ahead before you go to the doctor’s office, public health clinic, or hospital. The local medical team will continue to provide the best possible care for you and our community.

Asymptomatic testing is currently available in Valdez for select high risk populations, including those who interact with the public at work and those with state of Alaska travel vouchers. The Valdez Unified Command and public health officials continue to closely monitor the rapidly changing course of COVID-19. We ask the community to practice compassion and remember that behind every case count number is a person dealing with a difficult diagnosis. We remain committed to providing information, support, and resources to protect the health, safety, and well-being of Valdez during this unprecedented time.
